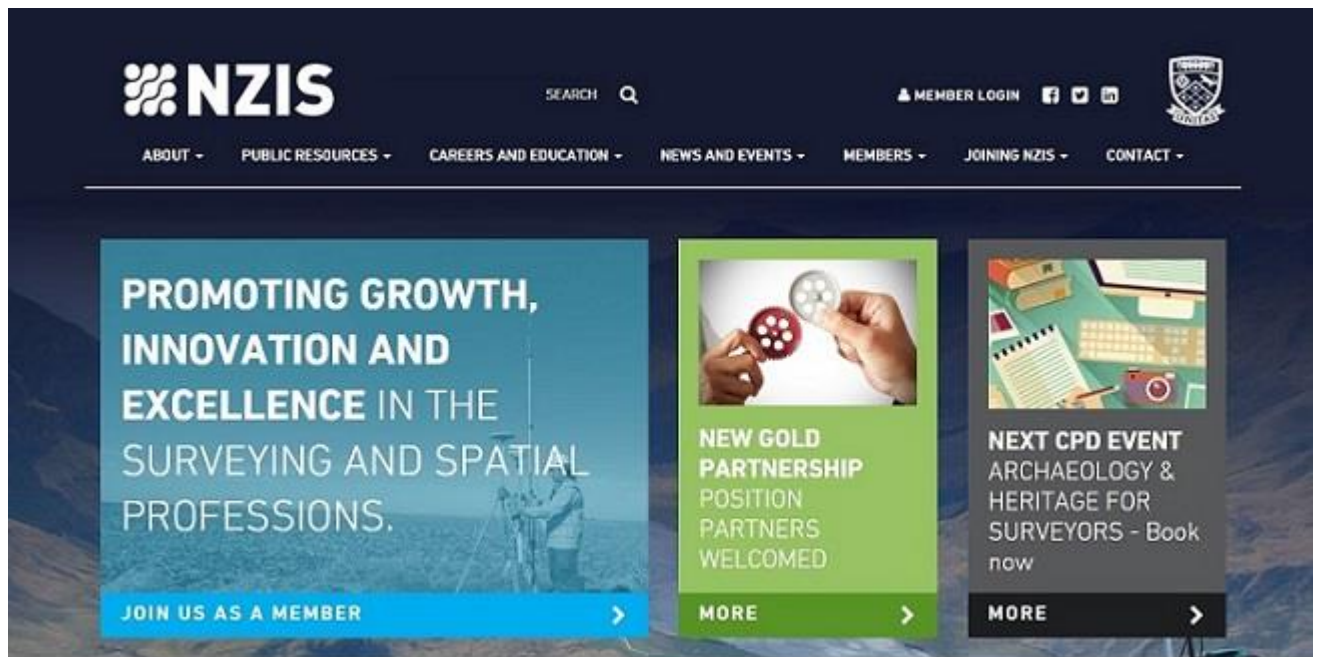


## NEW NZIS WEBSITE- LAUNCHING SOON!!

### Recent Legislative Case-Note Summaries

#### Summaries of cases from Thomson Reuter's "Your Environment".

This month we report on seven court decisions covering diverse situations associated with subdivision, development and land use activities from around the country:

- *An appeal relating to properties in the Queenstown basin upon retrospective application for variation of earthworks conditions and the relevance of varied consent notices on an adjacent subdivided property;*
- *An appeal at Hamilton where consideration of provisions in a proposed district plan included assessment of the status of a "comprehensive development plan" resulted in amended provisions to provide clarity to the situation;*
- *An appeal against charges levied by Porirua City Council which included additional traffic impact assessments for an application to expand a café at Pauatahanui;*
- *The decision of the Environment Court on an appeal by an environmental group on the grounds of hazard and risk of collapse of a consented irrigation dam in North Canterbury;*
- *An unsuccessful appeal to the Court of Appeal relating to evidence obtained by Auckland Council under an apparently faulty search warrant relating to alleged breaches of an abatement notice at a multi-unit residential property;*
- *An enforcement order and costs decision involving a Mr Lau and others who had undertaken illegal development and building work on several properties at Auckland.*
