The chosen theme is 'Frameworks for the Future' reflecting that the survey/spatial industry as a whole is changing and this theme captures that shift. It is about re-imagining how we go about our work as an industry and what fundamental frameworks need to be in place to support these changes. Presentations will challenge our 'future' thinking and further our understanding and connections across the spectrum of industry activity.

We have formed a National Technical Committee (NTC) to review the technical content for the conference to ensure it is relevancy for all levels of membership. This committee is made up of experienced individuals and stream and division representativess to ensure the theme, key issues and case studies are innovative and nationally focused. The NTC is searching for speakers to present on topics that can challenge our 'future' thinking and further our understanding and connections across the spectrum of industry activity. These frameworks may include:

- Understanding the fundamental information frameworks that will underpin the future direction of our industry
- Exploring the changing technology that is disrupting our industry
- Developing and supporting our industry capability framework, through our current and future industry professionals
- Understanding and harnessing innovation frameworks to support sustainability and resilience
- Collaborating and connecting across streams and branches for more integrated and holistic approaches to tackle future challenges.

The NTC is still exploring topics and already has some key threads within this theme, including:

- Kaikoura Earthquake Innovation for response and recovery, and lessons for future resilience
- Information Frameworks for the future: ASATs, 3D cadastre, Big data, etc.

Summaries of cases from Thomson Reuter's "Your Environment".

This month we report on four court decisions covering diverse situations associated with subdivision, development and land use activities from around the country:

- A jurisdictional challenge associated with an enforcement order sought by Thames-Coromandel District Council. In this case, the recipients of the order had carried out unauthorised earthworks on their property but claimed that Maori land was not subject to the RMA or its processes;
- A case in Auckland that considered the question: "Is the holder of a current but unimplemented land use resource consent required to obtain a further resource consent for the already consented activity when a new or changed plan provision came into effect?
- An unsuccessful appeal against the decision of Christchurch City Council to reconsent the existing wind turbine electricity generator, at Gebbies Pass on Banks Peninsula;
- A successful appeal by Southland Fish & Game NZ against consent granted by Southland District Council for development of a cycle trail adjoining the upper Oreti River, a world-famous trout fishing river;

Also in the other news, we have two important news items:

- one is a report of a decision on a major challenge to the Auckland Unitary Plan of particular interest to members operating in the Auckland area, and;
- the other is an announcement from Hon Dr Nick Smith about the establishment of an urban development authority.
