SNAP webinars

LINZ, Otago University & NZIS are producing webinars to provide training for LINZ's SNAP least-squares adjustment software. The webinars are aimed to be completed for delivery in July 2017. The first webinar will serve as an introduction to SNAP, stepping through some typical workflows, and aim to be accessible to users with limited experience. A second webinar will address more complex features of SNAP, and will be aimed at more advanced users.
