

SURVEY AND SPATIAL NEW ZEALAND ROTORUA / BAY OF PLENTY BRANCH TERTIARY SCHOLARSHIP

Purpose

The aim of the scholarship is to give students considering a career in land surveying an incentive to commence a course in land surveying in New Zealand.

In New Zealand there are several tertiary institutions offering programmes to equip students for a career in Land Surveying or Spatial Technology. The primary tertiary providers of the National Diploma in Surveying are TePukenga-Unitec and TePukenga-Toi-Ohomai. A Bachelor of Surveying degree can be studied at the University of Otago. Courses in Spatial Technology are also available. (eg BAppSc GIS at Otago)

<u>Criteria</u>

An application will be accepted from any student who:

- 1. Intends to enrol as a first time surveying student to undertake study for a course in surveying at any of the S+SNZ supported New Zealand tertiary providers.
- 2. Alternatively, intends to enrol in a Spatial technology course (at minimum diploma level).
- 3. Has a sound academic record;
- 4. Is a New Zealand citizen;
- 5. Is of good character;
- 6. Is currently completing their final year of secondary school education or has done so within the last two years and attended a secondary school in the Bay of Plenty region (Tauranga, Whakatane, Rotorua and Taupo).

Amount

The scholarship, awarded annually, will be \$1,000 for the successful candidate.

\$500 will be paid by 31 March on proof of enrolment in the approved course at the start of the year, and the second \$500 will be paid at the end of the year on proof of meeting all the course requirements. The second instalment will be paid within 30 days of the receipt of results.

Survey and Spatial New Zealand, Bay of Plenty / Rotorua Branch will give consideration to applications for any tertiary course focussed on land surveying or spatial technology, as described in the paragraph 'Purpose', above. At its discretion and subject to consideration of all applications, a maximum of two scholarships can be awarded in any one year.

Selection Committee

The scholarship will be awarded by a Selection Committee made up of members of the Rotorua / Bay of Plenty Branch of Survey and Spatial NZ. A Committee of four members will be elected or re-elected at the AGM each year. No more than two committee members shall retire in any one year.

The Committee will award the scholarship based on the application received and an interview with the prospective applicants. Applicants will be notified by mail of the Committee's interview programme. Applicants will be given seven days notice of any interview and interviews will be held during the first two weeks of February.

Selection of scholarship recipients will be solely by the Committee, consulting with any persons they may chose. The Committee will follow a formal selection process and any decisions made will be final.

If in the instance that proof of enrolment paperwork cannot be produced, or entrance to the tertiary institution is not achieved, then the Committee shall award the scholarship to a reserve candidate.

Receipt of Awards

Successful candidates will be notified by mail. Unsuccessful candidates will also be notified by mail. The schools of the successful candidates will be notified.

Survey and Spatial New Zealand may make a public presentation of the scholarships and may make public announcements and issue press releases about the awarding of scholarships. This includes names of recipients and course details at any time without restriction.

The Rotorua / Bay of Plenty Branch will endeavour to source opportunities for work experience in the region during the year of their award, within tertiary holidays if the candidate wishes. It is expected that candidates will take up this opportunity wherever possible. This experience will be provided to encourage and assist the award successful candidate with their studies, and to promote the Rotorua, Tauranga, Whakatane and Taupo areas as a great place to work and live.
