



**Q2 Has there been any discussion or agreement with the company you work for about what would happen if you received a Section 52 notice?**





**Q4 Would you be happy to contribute to a fund that would cover Section 52 costs for all surveyors who sign CSD's?**



### Q5 Who should be responsible for the correction of any errors in a CSD?



**Q6 There should be a time limit after the CSD is approved as to when the Surveyor General can require an error to be corrected under Section 52. Do you agree?**




