Environment Court Judgment re
Conversion of cross-lease title to freehold
title



What was the case about?

Declaration sought that crosslease title conversion was not a subdivision under s218 RMA

S+SNZ supported Don McKay's application (Cost about \$20k excl staff & volunteer time)

Judgment

Application declined **BUT** Judge commented on scope of council power to impose conditions on subdivision:

“the consent authority should generally approach such an application in a way that is mindful of the possibility that there may be few, if any, material environmental implications warranting a full-scale assessment of the proposal as if it were a new development” [55]

Options re Judgment

Board considered 4 options & selected one:

- ~~1. Appeal~~
- ~~2. Advocate for legislative change~~
3. Advocate for less onerous council conditions
- ~~4. Do nothing~~

Advocate for Legislative Change

- ***we can't drive* legislative change**
- **legislation takes a *long time* from policy development to actual law (2-3 years min)**
- ***low priority* 1999 Law Commission Report recommendations not yet implemented.
Large effort by NZIS at that time, for no result.**

Advocate for less onerous council conditions

Start by developing an effective argument in letter to TA's - propose solutions:

Controlled Activity – minimise assessment required

Acceptance of “fit for purpose” as Engineering standard for title conversions :

- **accept common private drains in easements**
- **accept existing pavements**

Advocate for less onerous council conditions

- **Branches/CSNZ use letter on TA contacts at all levels**
- **Seek follow up meetings to influence & advocate**
- **Record & Map the response of TA's**
- **Spread the argument to news media, LGNZ, property organisations e.g. PINZ, REINZ, Property Council, NZPI**
